

My name is Tamara Janies and I am a Coordinated Entry Specialist with Tahoe Coalition for the Homeless, our main office is located in South Lake Tahoe but I work on the West Slope. Coordinated Entry intakes are considered the Front Door, to homeless services in El Dorado County. I work throughout our County, both on the phone and in person, in an effort to provide access to information and services regarding homelessness. Additionally, I work with the clients to remove the barriers to housing and with other providers, to utilize all services available in an effort to move the client forward. Let me just say, "I love what I do and the people I do it with".

I started working with Karen Stinson and the wonderful folks at the Upper Room about three or four years ago, together we did quarterly clothing giveaways for the clients. As soon as my job changed to Coordinated Entry Specialist, I started doing intakes weekly at the Upper Room. It was immediately apparent, this was a match made in heaven. Since that time, TCH and the Upper Room have become close working companions. We have done street outreach, clothing giveaways, outreach to low-income families and most importantly, we have worked together to house and provide shelter for many of our mutually vulnerable clients.
